## **Emergency Exercises**

 The Department of Transportation, with support from Municipal and Community Affairs' (MACA) continues to deliver its emergency exercise approach for small communities which provides critical community-based emergency response training followed immediately by a live exercise.

#### **Emergency Exercises Status**

- The training consists of On-Scene Controller, triage, packaging and transport, all of which is tailored to meet the specific needs of our community responders.
- As of January 1st 2017, 19 communities have been taken through the process including the basic first responder training with over 200 people throughout the north.
- This year's exercises in Fort McPherson, Colville Lake, Paulatuk, Tulita, Gameti, and Fort Smith will continue to use this approach
